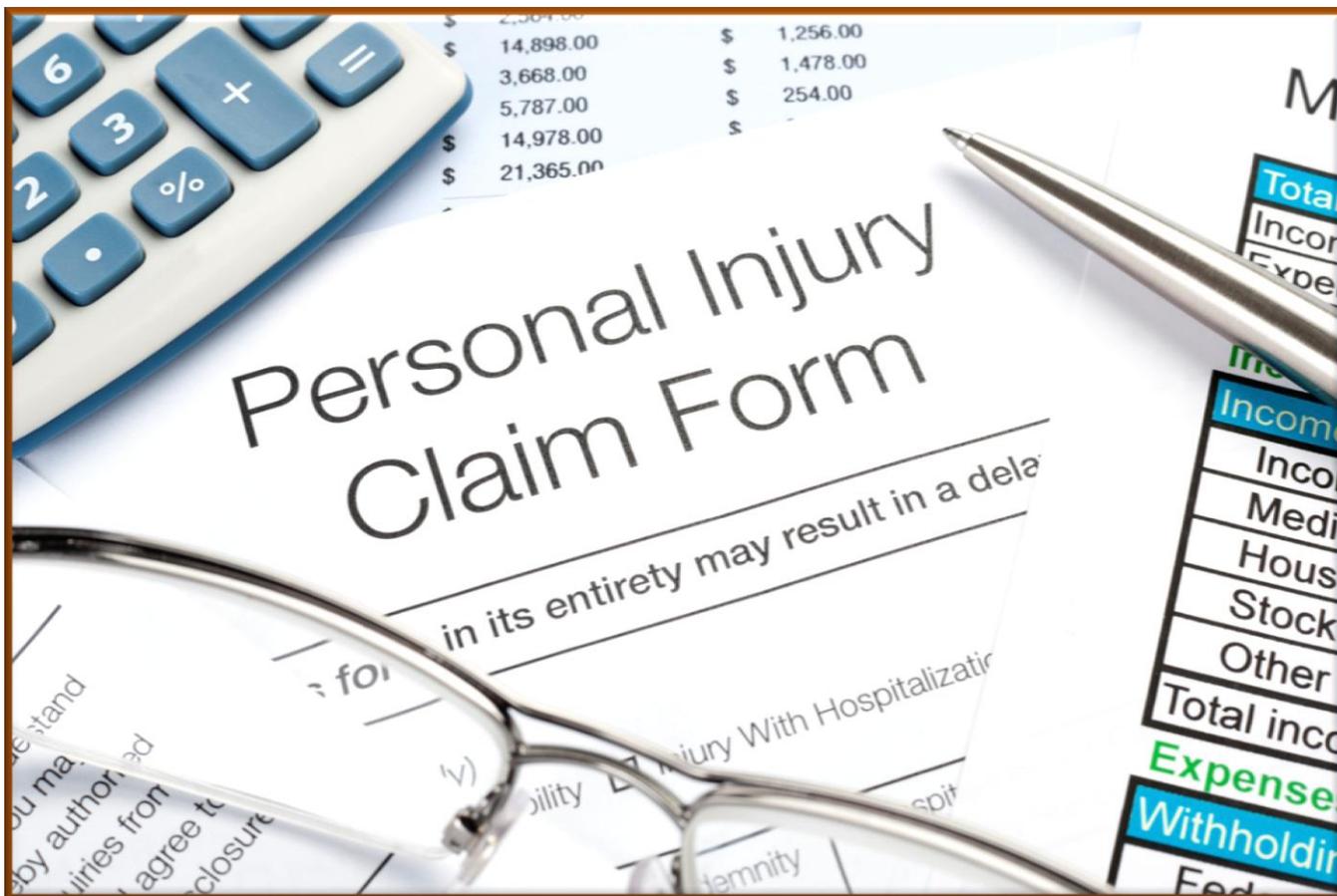


BASIC ADVICE FOR FILING A PERSONAL INJURY CLAIM IN WISCONSIN

This is particularly true when it comes to any conversations with an insurance company. You are better off keeping quiet until you have a personal injury attorney guiding you.

3. Collect as much evidence as possible. A police report is a great place to start, as this will show the finer details of the accident from the view point of the police. Along with this, don't be shy about collecting physical evidence while also taking photos from the accident scene.

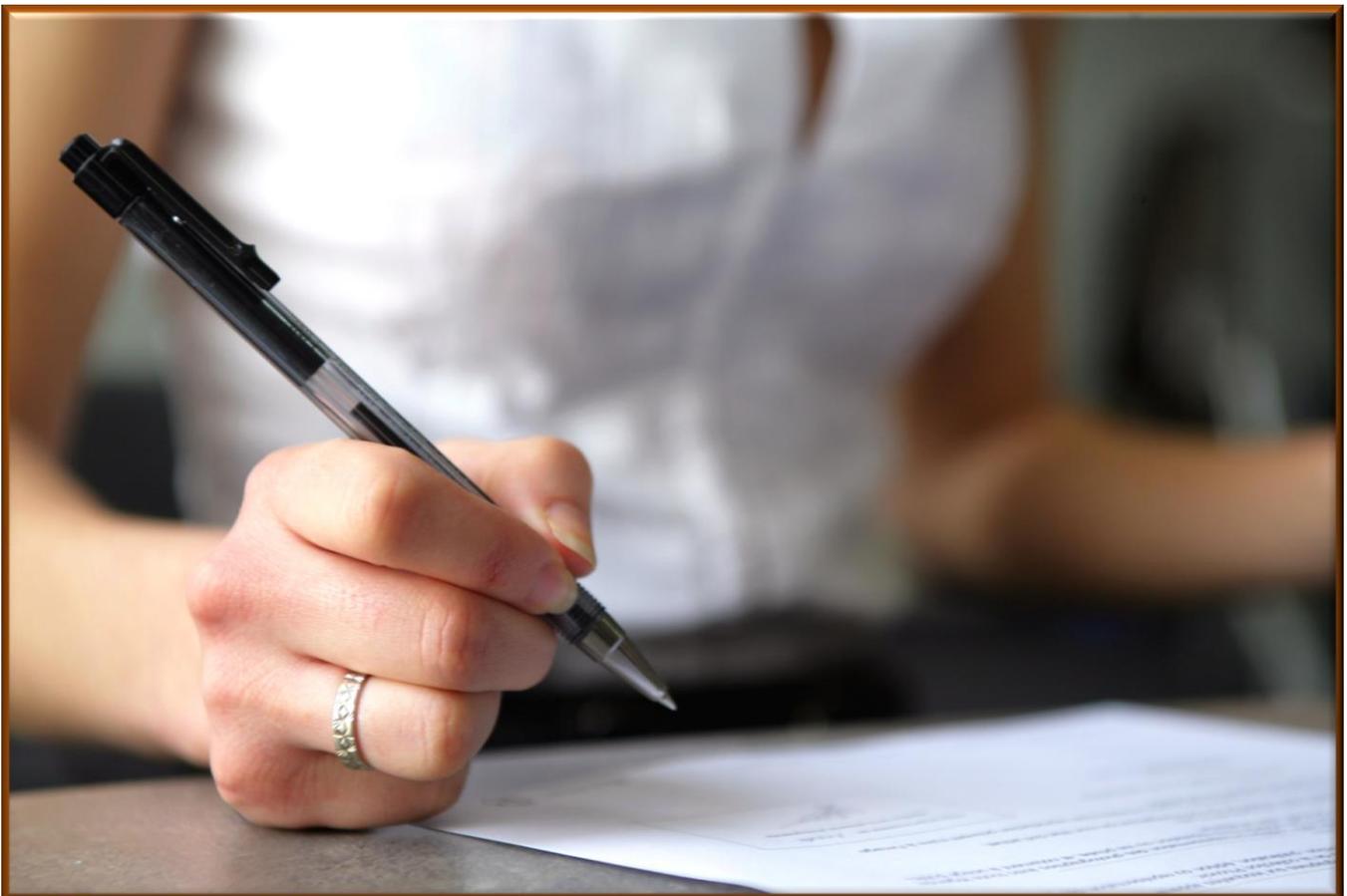
The severity of the accident may make it difficult for you to collect evidence. Your health and well being comes before anything else.
