


TRUCK ACCIDENTS QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS IN WISCONSIN

To clear the air, here are several of the most commonly asked questions:

1. Why do truck accidents often cause more injury than other types? The simple answer to this question is that trucks are bigger than passenger vehicles. For this reason, when the two are involved in an accident it is the smaller vehicle, and those inside, that are at the greatest risk of damage and injury.

The size difference greatly increases the chance of passengers in the smaller vehicle being killed.

2. What are some of the many reasons why truck accidents are so common? A truck accident can be caused by anything from distracted driving to driving under the influence. Along with this, there are times when a trucker does not obey the rules of the road, such as when they drive faster than the speed limit on the highway.

Note: truckers and their respective company have a duty to keep their rig in good working condition. Improper maintenance has the potential to cause an accident.

3. Can the victim in a truck accident file a lawsuit to collect compensation? This depends on the circumstances of the accident, but in many cases the answer is yes. In most cases, it is the truck driver and/or the trucking company that is held legally liable.

Note: a qualified attorney can review the finer details of your accident to determine who is legally responsible. At that point, it becomes much clearer how to move forward with a lawsuit.



Medical Care First

If injured in a truck accident, you will be upset that the other party acted in a negligent manner. While you may be able to file a lawsuit to collect compensation, there is nothing more important than your health.
